#### The Season of Discovery

Dear Parishioners,

This year I attended the Dublin Clergy Conference. It was held in Kilkenny on 3 days in February.

One of the speakers was Michael Mitton who talked about life in the desert, the wilderness. An interesting theme as we approach Lent when we think of Jesus in the wilderness.

Michael has written an interesting book "Seasoned by Seasons – Flourishing in Life's Experiences". I thought we would examine some of the themes of this interesting book during this Lenten season. He states that we have to recognise that in our own journey of the soul, the seasons do not necessarily follow the order that we see in the outer world.

In that world, spring follows winter, and autumn always follows summer. But in the seasons of the soul, we can experience a beautiful springtime, but then a sudden loss can throw us into an autumn. One season may last several months, and another a few days. There is really no telling which season is coming next. But in the Bible stories that we will examine they tell us that we are given what we need to face whichever season comes our way.

Lent can be a season of discovery. Over the Sundays in Lent, we will examine some important themes:-

1st March- 1st Sunday in Lent: Guilt, the discovery of Wisdom (David)

8th March - 2nd Sunday in Lent: Despair, the discovery of Hope (Isaiah)

**15th March** - **3rd Sunday in Lent**: Failure, the discovery of Being (Samaritan Woman)

**29th March** - **5th Sunday in Lent / Passion Sunday:** Confusion, the discovery of Light (Nicodemus)

**5th April** - **6th Sunday in Lent / Palm Sunday:** Crisis, the discovery of Presence (Daniel)

I hope you will be able to come along to discover together.

## **Christian Aid visit to the Parish**

On Sunday 2nd February, Christian Aid's Church and Community Officer, Dee Huddleston, spoke in both St Mary's Church, Clonsilla, and St. Brigid's Church, Castleknock, about the climate crisis and how Christian Aid is working to help some of the world's poorest communities to adapt to its worst effects.



2020 is a make or break year for the planet when it comes to tackling the climate crisis. Dee shared with us

the personal story of Christian Aid's Rev. Bob Kikuyu about how a changing climate is causing the crops on his parent's farm to fail and how this has impacted their lives. Dee also spoke about how Christian Aid and their local partner ADSE are helping communities in Eastern Kenya to adapt to drought and poor rains by building earth and sand dams which provide them with access to much needed water that they use to grow crops and feed their families.
