Dear Parishioners,

We were pleased that we were able to come back to church from the beginning of July. The restrictions are tight, and we have abided by the Government / Church Guidelines. This includes no singing in church. This is very strange for Church of Ireland parishioners, as hymn-singing is an important part of our worship.

We have three services each Sunday, at 10.00 a.m. in St. Mary's Church, Clonsilla, at 11.30 a.m. in St. Brigid's Church, Castleknock, and at 7.00 p.m. in St. Thomas' Church, Mulhuddart. Moreover, we have begun to have Holy Communion on the first and third Sundays of the month, and we also have our mid-week Wednesday Holy Communion, in St. Brigid's Church, Castleknock, at 10.30 a.m. We are giving Communion in one kind only, bread / wafers, as guided

by the Bishop. This is to be reviewed in November.

Rectors Annual Report 2020

This has been quite an exceptional year for the church and for everyone.

As someone joked, I don't know why I brought a 2020year planner! One thing that was postponed from both parishes was the General Easter Vestry meeting, normally held around Easter. This is a triennial election year, when we not only elect a Select Vestry, Churchwardens and Glebewardens but also representatives for Diocesan Synod and Parochial Nominators. So we meet today as we were told that this work had to be done if the Diocesan Synod is to meet in October.

In-person church services had to be stopped on St Patrick's Day. I was sorry that the Confirmation service with the Archbishop, due to take place on the next Sunday, 22nd March, did not happen. The archbishop wrote to all the candidates about the postponement.

The work of the church and church services have continued, virtually. The online streaming of services from March, I think have been appreciated. In that regard, I would like to thank Philip Good, my wife Adrienne and Jenny McGrath, and all who took part in those services.

We were able to return to the churches for worship at the beginning of July, with a maximum attendance of 50 and following government guidelines. Sadly, we are not allowed to sing in church, but we thank Fern Bartley, our organist, for playing for us. Another change has been Holy Communion in one kind, i.e. bread/wafers. This is strange for Church of Ireland parishioners, however, this will be reviewed in November.

I have tried to keep in contact with parishioners through email and phone calls to our house-bound and the sick. I hope I can get back to pastoral visiting soon. I am pleased to say there have been no deaths in the Parish due to Covid-19, although some have caught the disease. Our hearts and sympathises go out to all who have been bereaved and all frontline workers at this difficult time.

Moreover, I am very involved in two schools, Castleknock National School and Castleknock Community College, our best wishes go to the Principals, staff and students as they reopen. I called in at C.N.S. and C.C.C. and realise the tremendous work taking place to have all the pupils back safely. In the

summer I was busy appointing three new teachers to C.N.S. and they are settling in well.

The Parish Centre in Castleknock had to also closed its doors. We are gradually re-opening the centre on a phased basis, again keeping in line with government guidelines.

Over the year, 2019-2020, we were able to have our Family Fun Day in September and the Winter Fair last November, as well as the Wednesday Club outings. We will have to see what is possible over this coming year.

I was pleased before the lockdown to have the tarmacadam in the churchyard in St. Brigid's re-laid, it is a fine job. Moreover, we had a new lighting conductor installed on the church spire! Added to this, columbarium walls were put up in St. Brigid's and St. Thomas' (graves can be pre-purchased in St. Thomas'). In St. Mary's a new area has been laid out for a columbarium.

Before the lockdown we were planning to celebrate 150 years since Disestablishment when the Church of Ireland gained its own 'home rule' and its independence from the state. All churches were to be open on culture night – again plans have had to be put on hold.

We have continued the search for a curate over the past year, using a number of methods to fill this position, including advertising in the Church Times. The Archbishop has indicated that he will keep us in mind for a curate. A trainee deacon was offered from September who would assist a few days a week and on Sundays but this had to be deferred also.

I would like to thank Stella Obe, our lay-reader for her help and hope she keeps well.

Finally, I would like to thanks the select vestries – for all their work and service. To our organist and choir director and the choir, I still recall the lovely services, the harvest, advent carol service and Christmas carol service, that we had last year.

I want to thank all our church workers, Sunday club, youth organisations and all our groups for their work. I wish them well over the next year.
