Revised restrictions from 22nd January 2022

It is important to remember that the last two years have been a difficult journey for everyone. There has been worry and fear, and at times we have had very tough restrictions to cope with. We continue to remember those in our parish and further afield who have died in the last two years and with those who have lost loved ones.

We are still awaiting guidance for public worship from authorities, however, the COVID regulations have changed and we are entering a new phase of this pandemic where we can be a little more hopeful that the end is in sight.

There are many who will welcome this change and wish to return to a more normal life but there are others who will still be extremely cautious and wary about this new phase of the pandemic. Covid has not gone away and it is vitally important that we are vigilant. If anyone has tested positive for Covid or is a close household contact, it is important that you do not attend services. We need to be mindful of everyone in our parish by our actions.

It is recommended that masks continue to be worn throughout the services. Tea and coffee will not be provided at the moment after services, but this will be reviewed over the coming months.

The government restrictions regarding social distancing have been lifted, however, we continue to take a cautious approach and would ask that you be mindful of those who may still be 'shielding' for someone vulnerable at home or that may be wary of being too close to others both during the service and afterwards.

Further instructions will be provided during the services as required. The select vestries will also be discussing the best way forward for everyone over the coming weeks.

Without the support of everyone in this parish it would not have been possible to continue the work of the church during this pandemic. Let us pray that we can continue to keep everyone safe as we gather to worship together as a community.

We are delighted to report that we have welcomed lots of new members into
