Notes from Norman

During the present vacancy, it will not be possible to make the move to weekly services in St Thomas's which normally occurred when the clocks change to summer time, but there will be a monthly service on the 3rd Sunday of a month at 7pm. In April that will be Easter Day, when there will be a celebration of the Eucharist.

There will be a service in St Brigid's during Holy Week each evening at 8pm, the theme of our thoughts being titles used of Jesus, and their significance for us today in the context of the Cross. The titles are 'The Good Shepherd', 'The Son of Man', The Lamb of God', King of the Jews' and, 'The Suffering Servant'. Full details will be in next magazine, as well as internal parish emails.

Easter Vestries

 Both of our select vestries met in early February and amended the General Vestry lists and set dates for the ■ annual Easter Vestry meetings. For Castleknock & ■ Mulhuddart in St Brigid's it will be on Sunday 10th April at 12.15 p.m. and in St Mary's for Clonsilla on Sunday 24th April ■ at 11.15 a.m. The Easter Vestry meetings are the parish AGMs and it is very important that people turn out and participate, and so we are giving plenty of notice. The eagleeyed will perceive that the time is immediately after the ■ Sunday service, and we ask those who come to remember that public worship is at the very core of a parish's witness, and to prepare for the meeting by partaking in the worship being offered that morning. All may attend, but only those who are on the General Vestry register are entitled to vote.

Worship

Both our Select Vestries have given time to working out how best to resume pre-pandemic worship in our churches. Things are not quite back to normal, and it will be some time • before they are, but already we have removed all the spacing barriers which made the churches look a bit like a garda 'crime scene'. You may sit where you like, but we ask you to be sensible in spacing yourselves, and to think of • others and wear a face covering. You should also sanitise your hands on entering the Church. However, those leading worship or reading lessons should not wear face coverings when doing so. Holy Communion is now being distributed at ■ the Communion rails and arrangements are being made for ■ the distribution of the wine using small individual disposable plastic cups. This may be done first in St Brigid's where

there is a vast amount of space at the front of the church, and in Mulhuddart where the congregations are much smaller. Clonsilla is very congested for this purpose and will need extra care. Communion wafers will remain in use for the time being to minimise handling.

We have been singing for some time, but somewhat muzzled * through face-masks. Our organist, Fern Bartley, is eager to resume a wider use of singing, and will be getting the choir together and looking for new volunteers. This will be a slow business, with some time before the choir in Castleknock resume their place in the gallery. However, the select vestry are happy with the risk factor of Covid spread will be minimised. In Clonsilla, we will probably reserve pews in front of the organ for the choir as a starting base. Let us also • remember that we like the Psalmist, making a joyful noise unto the Lord is a valued and inspiring part of Christian worship from which this pandemic has deprived us for far too long!

We will also be asking everyone to still use a non-contact gesture at the sign of peace at the Eucharist: an embracing wave is just as much a sign of peace as a handshake or a hug, and probably healthier in present circumstances! It will also be some time before we will be having tea, coffee and other refreshments after worship. However, instead of heading home after a service, both churches have ample gathering space outside our doors and the weather is already warming up!

I would stress that what is outlined here are steps on an uncompleted journey. Covid is still hanging around albeit in Omicron a seemingly less dangerous form than on its first arrival. But we will have to be careful and take the restoration of what was once normal behaviour one step at a time.

I would however say that the Vestries and Churchwardens have done a marvellous job in keeping the parish going, and our churches are probably as safe as our own houses and I would ask those who may have been staying at home as a precaution to consider that we have reached a situation where we can all return to the fellowship of God and each other in worship. We will be continuing to stream services: it is of great benefit to the housebound and those who may be away on a particular Sunday.

Bishops' Appeal - Ukraine

Support for refugees channelled through Habitat for **Humanity & Christian Aid**

The Church of Ireland Bishops' Appeal for World Aid and Development has committed €10,000 (£8,300) from its emergency funds to assist with the humanitarian response to the current crisis in Ukraine. Bishops' Appeal is partnering with Habitat for Humanity Ireland and Christian Aid, and encouraging parishes across the island to contribute to our response to help people seeking refuge.

Jenny Williams, Chief Executive of Habitat for Humanity Ireland, remarked: "UNHCR reports that over 500,000 people fled Ukraine into neighbouring and nearby countries from 24th February to 1st March. We have strong programmes in Poland, Hungary and Romania and our European office is in Slovakia so we are on the ground responding. Habitat is meeting UNHCR daily and co-ordinates with governments to add value and ensure there isn't duplication of effort. Colleagues from Hungary and Romania spent the weekend at their borders. In Romania, the need was to provide additional heat for a camp – even more important given that there was more snow at the weekend and people were cold. More broadly our focus is on supporting the shelter needs of refugees, ensuring that more people can feel safe. We will support them for the long term."

Christian Aid's funds will go to sister agencies in the ACT Alliance. This network of Christian aid and development agencies includes the Lutheran World Federation and Hungarian Church Aid which are both working in neighbouring • countries. As the situation within Ukraine is changing by the day and there is a high level of violence within the country, Bishops' Appeal will not be funding work within Ukraine at this stage although this will be kept under consideration.

The Most Revd John McDowell, Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland, said: "The tragic and wholly avoidable destruction which we are witnessing in Ukraine leaves many of us in the West lost for words and at a loss to know how best to respond to alleviate suffering. However, wars always create refugees and I am grateful that Bishops' Appeal is targeting its immediate aid efforts to assist trusted agencies working in neighbouring countries to help those who have been displaced by this invasion. I would urge all parishes to consider helping Bishops' Appeal to increase the aid which it can provide by contributing generously in one of the ways outlined below."

The Most Revd Dr Michael Jackson, Archbishop of Dublin and Primate of Ireland, said: "The developing and declining situation in Ukraine has already had devastating consequences for hundreds of thousands of people. Prayerful assistance and practical assistance are both important components of our response. I commend the current initiative by Bishops' Appeal."

Lydia Monds, Bishops' Appeal's Education Advisor, added: "Bishops' Appeal will continue to monitor access to refugees so that we as a Church can stand in solidarity with them and support them in the most effective ways possible. We will only release funding through channels that enable vital aid to reach those who need it most. We will continue to liaise with partner agencies working on the ground to provide relief. Our emergency funds will be released immediately and we invite parishes to continue to give to the Appeal so that we can continue to support efforts in aconstantly evolving crisis."
