parents arrived to collect them.


The sleepover was definitely one of the highlights of the year for the girls and they will always have great memories

from this night.










Living Faith, Living History



On Friday 1st April in
Christ Church
Cathedral, a new book
highlighting the history
of the Church of
Ireland parishes
through the eyes of
school children in
Dublin and
Glendalough was

launched. The book was written by children in ten Church of Ireland schools around the United Dioceses of Dublin & Glendalough including our own Castleknock National School.

Last year 4th & 5th class pupils from Castleknock National School and their teacher, Ms Furney, were involved in this project. The project also involved visiting the church and interviewing a number of parishioners who visited the school via zoom and were interviewed by the pupils and our former Rector, Canon Paul, gave the pupils a tour of the church.

A number of awards were presented at the launch event and Castleknock NS received an award for their interviews with the parishioners.

The school are delighted to be able to leave a copy of the book, which is a compilation of all the wonderful work done by the children involved in the project, at the back of St Brigid's Church for anyone who would like to look at it.

The project was a shared initiative between the Church of Ireland Centre in DCU, the United Dioceses of Dublin & Glendalough and Christ Church Cathedral Dublin. The exhibition and publication were supported by grants from All Churches Trust, the Advisory Council of the Church of Ireland Centre, DCU and the Church Education Society. The book of the children's projects is published by Cadolux.

Further Support for Ukraine from Church of Ireland Bishops' Appeal

The Church of Ireland's Bishops' Appeal for World Aid and Development is releasing a further €40,000 and £35,000 to Christian Aid and Habitat for Humanity support of humanitarian efforts in Ukraine and the surrounding countries. This brings the total released so far to €50,000 and £43,300.

Donations continue to pour in, and Bishops' Appeal therefore anticipates releasing more funds shortly after Easter. Financial support is being utilised as soon as it is received and even in anticipation of being received, such is the need.

Partner agencies continue to focus on people who have been displaced within Ukraine and who have become refugees in Romania, Hungary, Slovakia and Poland. They are providing both temporary shelters and longer-term accommodation, food, money and vouchers, help with travel, and medical





supplies, and are responding to more specific needs as they arise. So far, 10 million people have fled their homes – 3.5 million fleeing to other countries and a further 6.5 million displaced in Ukraine itself. This makes up nearly one quarter of the country's population.

Bishop Ferran Glenfield, Bishop of Kilmore, Elphin and Ardagh and Chair of the Bishops' Appeal Advisory Committee, says: "Irish people north and

south are known for being big hearted. The plight of the Ukrainian people has touched many hearts, which is reflected in

the generous response to the Ukraine Appeal across the Church of Ireland."
