Rector Writes

Dear parishioners,

In the yearly cycle of any parish September is always a busy month of activity as organisations start up again, another school year begins and the summer holidays draw to an end. For Janice and I amongst the busyness, we are also hoping for a new beginning as we are set this month to move into the new Rectory. The prospect of packing up again after only a few months is not overly appealing but that will be trumped by the excitement of a beautiful new home and the opportunity of truly settling in and getting to know our new community (well rather newer for me than for Janice). We offer our thanks to the two select vestries and especially the Castleknock Glebe Wardens, James Anderson and Gordon Kellett, for all their hard work in securing the new Rectory.

New beginnings can feel equally as daunting as they are exciting. That first day of school can be a time of great unsettlement not only for the child but perhaps more so for the parent (thanks to our wonderful school PA for providing the "Tea and Tissues" on the first morning). My daughters are making their way into third level education with Madison living away from home for the first time, another time of uncertainty. In church many of our organisations and activities are starting up again (or at least meeting indoor in-person) for the first time since the pandemic. Plans are afoot for the return of the Winter Fair, Harvest Festival Services are coming and we are even starting to plan ahead for the Christmas season. While we are excited to be looking forward to all of these (I particularly am as they will be firsts for me in the parishes), understandably there is still some anxiety and uncertainty as to how Covid will play out over the autumn and winter.

It is never easy starting afresh, even if the outcome looks exciting. The Irish poet and priest John O'Donohue in his poem "For A New Beginning" (from "To Bless This Space Between Us") beautifully encompasses the journey of new beginnings - In out-of-the-way places of the heart, Where your thoughts never think to wander, This beginning has been quietly forming, Waiting until you were ready to emerge.

For a long time it has watched your desire, Feeling the emptiness growing inside you, Noticing how you willed yourself on, Still unable to leave what you had outgrown.

It watched you play with the seduction of safety And the gray promises that sameness whispered, Heard the waves of turmoil rise and relent, Wondered would you always live like this.

Then the delight, when your courage kindled, And out you stepped onto new ground, Your eyes young again with energy and dream, A path of plenitude opening before you.

Though your destination is not yet clear You can trust the promise of this opening; Unfurl yourself into the grace of beginning That is at one with your life's desire.

Awaken your spirit to adventure; Hold nothing back, learn to find ease in risk; Soon you will home in a new rhythm, For your soul senses the world that awaits you. Many over the past couple of years have drifted away from attending church for many differing reasons. The pandemic changed how we lived and our rhythms of life. It may feel like coming back, giving church a fresh start is a daunting prospect. Is it really for me? Will I belong? People like me aren't welcome in church ... those and other questions or reasons may have crossed your mind. The answer is that there is a place for you and you will be made welcome whoever you are.

The Old Testament Book of Ruth has a wonderful story of new beginnings as the young widow Ruth risks all to follow her mother-in-law to a new land in the uncertain hope of a new beginning. Ruth begs her mother-in-law "Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God." Ruth puts her trust in a God she does not know but who she decides to follow (the story is well worth a read to discover the outcome).

For those of you who haven't been with us for a while I'd like you to hear those words "please don't leave us" we believe that our churches are worth being a part of and we want you to experience that afresh. Perhaps it's time for a new beginning, you'll notice plenty of things that are both familiar and different.

For those of us who make up our church family we too are called to new beginnings. We have already seen people step forward to the challenge of training for Lay Reader training at both parish and Diocesan level. Over the coming months we will be seeking others to step forward to answer the call to serve. This month we launch our new All Age Service "**Cornerstone**" with breakfast church on Sunday 25th. We also unveil our new mission statement which will be displayed on our new signs, service sheets, etc. The vision for our churches reads:

A CHURCH OF GOD, A CHURCH FOR ALL

Growing together as a Christ-centred community where all are welcome, all are loved

That is to be our prayer and our goal whether we have been attending church for years, whether we've been away for a while and are finding the courage to return or like me you're new to the church community. It is an exciting prospect but it's also a daunting one to truly be a Church that glorifies God and is welcoming and loving to all. I believe through prayer, encouragement and love, God can do something new in our communities and if we're prepared to step out in faith, exciting times lie ahead.
