Rector Writes

Dear parishioners,

"All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above; then thank the Lord, O thank the Lord, for all his love."

Familiar words of one of the most recognisable hymns from our Church Hymnal, even though we tend to only sing "We plough the fields and scatter" in one particular season of the year. The end of September into the start of October is always a special time in the Church of Ireland as we come together to give thanks to God for the gifts of the harvest. While we may not live in rural Ireland surrounded by fields and farms, we can still take time to appreciate the hard work and skill that goes into farming the land and producing the food we so often take for granted.

When we decorate our churches with flowers and produce, we are not only producing something that is aesthetically pleasing to the eye (and nose), we are also acknowledging the cycle of the seasons, the works of our creator who "sends the snow in winter, the warmth to swell the grain, the breezes and the sunshine, and soft refreshing rain."

As we face an autumn and winter of uncertainty due to the cost of living crisis that is impacting across the country (and the world) - soaring bills for heating and electric and increases in the cost of our grocery shop – perhaps this year more than ever we are all thinking of what it means to have food on our table and warmth in our homes.

The overwhelming evidence of climate change, often affecting the poorest countries of the world in ways we cannot imagine, is a stark reminder of the damage done to our environment and the chasm between rich and poor. Therefore, as we come to the Harvest celebrations we come not only to give thanks but also to reflect upon our role in how we individually and as a church act as responsible stewards of the earth God has given us.

At our joint Harvest Thanksgiving Service in St Brigid's,

Castleknock (9th October at 11.30 a.m.), we will not only give thanks but also hear in a practical way how we can play our part in protecting the environment. Our guest speaker will be Justin Kilcullen who is a member of Eco-Congregations Ireland and has experienced how a local church can become more environmentally aware. Eco-Congregation Ireland (ECI) encourages churches of all denominations to take an eco-approach to worship, lifestyle, property and finance management, community outreach and contact with the developing world.

Their vision is to see churches of all denominations throughout Ireland celebrate the gift of God's creation, recognise the inter-dependence of all creation and care for it in their life and mission and through members' personal lifestyles.

We look forward to what Justin has to share with us as we begin to try to make a difference in even a small way in protecting and sustaining the environment.

It is often by taking small steps individually or together that we begin to start to see real change, even when we least expect it. Jesus told his followers if only they had "faith as small as a mustard seed" God could do wonderful things through them. Throughout the Bible we see examples of God using small acts to change lives, think of the small offering of loaves and fishes which managed to feed thousands (with plenty left over!). When we take a small step of faith the impact on those around us can be immeasurable. What can we do this harvest season to help the environment? Are there small changes we can make to our lifestyles that could make a big difference? What small act of kindness can we carry out that would mean so much to someone in our community? How could taking the small step of inviting someone to experience our church community impact upon their life?

At our Harvest services we are giving you the opportunity to take those small steps. We will be collecting items for a local foodbank to help those who are struggling. If you are able

please bring along a donation of toiletries or non-perishable food items. Following the Service on 9th October we are hosting an international lunch in Castleknock Parish Centre. We are inviting you to bring along a dish (anything at all either main course type or dessert), which we will all share with one another, sharing some of our favourite dishes with others. This is a wonderful opportunity to take that small step of inviting someone to join us.

We are also looking to see how we can be a blessing to our community in the coming months and years. I hope to put together a vision group who will help us seek God's guidance for the direction we go as a church over the coming years.

Perhaps this is something you might prayerfully consider being part of?

In all we do we remember to be thankful for the one who created us, created our world and who will lead us as we work to grow as a Church for God and a Church for all.

"We thank you, then, O Father, for all things bright and good, the seed-time and the harvest, our life, our health, our food."


Advance Notice
