Dear Friends,

As many of you know one of my big passions in life is rugby. Whether it's standing on the terrace of Ravenhill to cheer for the Ulster men or taking my seat at Landsdowne Road (yes, I know they've all got corporate names these days but I'm still a bit old school) once rugby season is upon us I love to get to as many games as possible.

# **Castleknock Parish Centre Works**

The Castleknock Parish Centre Committee have been working away over the summer in planning some refurbishment to Castleknock Parish Centre. The Centre is a wonderful resource for both our parishes and the local community but is approaching 30 years since it was officially opened and parts of the building were beginning to look a little tired and some repairs needed. The initial works have centred on the older part of the building, the office area, meeting area and Maharry Room.



That area of the building has had major plumbing works completed with new piping and radiators.



By early September the Maharry Room will have had a facelift and we really look forward to seeing the results. We were very keen to keep the essence of the room which was so beautifully decorated when the centre opened so hopefully the redecorating will help the room to continue to be a peaceful place to meet for our midweek Eucharists, prayer meeting and Bible Study as well as being available for wider use.

The office has been extended to take in the meeting room providing a much more spacious and airier environment. This means that entrance to the Maharry Room will be via the door on the corridor. The whole section of the building is being painted with new flooring in the Maharry Room and office area.

The Clonsilla Room has also been painted and the outside of the building is also to be painted. Going forward there are plans to replace all the external doors and to refit the

kitchen. The committee also continue to explore all possibilities to ensure the Centre is fully utilised for us as a church and to help serve our local community.

These works of course come at a cost and while the Centre has a working fund through income from bookings, it isn't a bottomless pit. We will be looking at some fundraising to help ensure the Centre continues to be a wonderful resource as well as exploring external funding possibilities. We thank the Parish Centre Committee for all their hard work.
