## RECTOR WRITES

Dear Friends,

In my report for the Easter General Vestries this year, I asked those present if they could recall our churches vision statement, which appears on our service sheets and other communications:

# PARISHES OF CASTLEKNOCK AND MULHUDDART WITH CLONSILLA A CHURCH OF GOD, A CHURCH FOR ALL

Growing together as a Christ-centered community where all are welcome, all are loved.

I began with a Scripture reading from 1 Corinthians chapter 12 in which Paul reminds the members of the church that although we are many with many varying gifts and abilities we are all one body in Christ. I then showed a short video on how geese when migrating fly in formations that enable all to reach their destination and in which all play their part in sharing leadership. The video told us that the geese honked at one in another in encouragement and I then posed the question was our honking positive or negative?

That's a really interesting question, is our honking (our comments and remarks, and our general attitude) the sound of encouragement? If we are to be one body and if our churches are to be "a church for God and a church for all" where all feel welcomed and all feel loved, surely our starting point is to be people who are encouraging and building up rather than critical.

With this in mind I want us to focus on the church being not about the building but rather the people. For me one of the most wonderful things about church is that it is a group of people from varying backgrounds, varying ages, etc., who come together with one purpose - to further the Kingdom of God. Of course that sounds wonderful in theory but the practicality of a community made up of very different people with different thoughts and ideas can also be challenging.

The truth is we don't always have to agree on everything, but we should never lose focus of that

common goal.

Therefore, the challenge to each of us in this church and in this community in



which we live and worship is are we in all we do seeking to be loving, giving and serving? Loving, giving and serving, three easy words to say but do they lie at the heart of who we are as a church? Does our worship, our activities, our outreach, and how we are viewed in our communities reflect a church where all will feel welcomed and all will feel loved?

So as we reflect upon this I ask the following questions:

- Does our vision tie into everything we do?
- Does our worship and activities link to being a church for all?
- Are we as clergy creating that culture as church leaders?
- Are we as clergy focusing on what is important?
- Are we ALL playing our part in seeking to fulfil the vision?

There are so many positive things happening in our parishes at the moment. We have embraced the vision I set forward in last year's Easter General Vestry. We have established a number of ministries and outreaches to both help us grow in faith and to serve our community. We have grown in our mission focus both locally and worldwide with our forthcoming Cambodia Mission trip. We have introduced new ways to worship, pray and study the Bible together. There is a wonderful vibrancy to our church services with the whole spectrum of ages. People are volunteering their time and talents to serve. There is so much to encourage us. Let's keep honking loudly for one another!

Church however is not about five year plans or clever words, our vision must be indoctrinated into the culture of all we do. So alongside the encouragement I lay down a challenge.

We all must ask ourselves, am I playing my part? We

need more people to share the responsibility and roles that are needed for our church to grow.

We all need to examine our financial giving with the ever increasing financial cost of being a church.

We must all question how much of ourselves we are prepared to give to serve others.

When we pray, when we actively seek to grow in faith, when we all play our part, when we give what we can of our gifts, talents and finances then we truly become A church of God and a Church for All.

This month sees the 2nd anniversary of my time as your Rector. I wish to thank you all for journeying with me, for allowing me to make mistakes and for the encouragement and support you give to Janice and myself. I thank you for enabling us to appoint a Curate and I thank Rev Natasha for not only all the talents and gifts she has brought to our churches but also her friendship.

It is a great joy and privilege to be your Rector and I pray that we continue to grow together and I really hope you feel our churches are a place where you are welcomed and you are loved.

Please continue to keep them in your prayers and encourage them as part of our church family.






## WANDER AND WONDER

The opportunity to worship together over food, chat and friendship is always an opportunity we should cherish.


