# RECTOR WRITES

Dear Friends,

As you read this I, along with 13 other members of our church family, will be in Cambodia working alongside Habitat for Humanity to provide a safe home for a family in desperate need. For my notes I have shared with you the story of Sreymao and her family who will soon have a new home:

Sreymao is a 43-year-old factory worker in Trapang Anhchanh 4 village in Porsenchey District, Phnom Penh. She works at a rice factory about 20 minutes away from home, specifically in the packaging production line. She earns approximately \$200 per month to support her family of 7 members. Her husband, Kosal, is a 46-year-old who used to work as a security guard in Phnom Penh. Kosal has been dealing with declining health for over ten years, leading to mental disability. Currently, he is in a more stable condition, but he is only staying at home to provide some assistance to the family. Sreymao remains resilient, striving to ensure her family has enough food and a place to stay, especially for her grandchildren.

Sreymao's family is one of the 200 families affected by the railway rehabilitation project in Khan Russei Keo of the



capital in 2011. They have accepted the government's offer of a 7-meter by 15-meter land plot in Sangkat Trapaing Krasang of Khan Porsenchey. Upon their arrival in Sangkat Trapaing Krasang, they

commenced the construction of their house using wood and an old zinc roof from their previous dwelling.

Sreymao's family encounters various challenges during rainy weather, including a leaking roof, damp walls, and

wet belongings and clothes. Furthermore, the house experiences instability during windstorms, prompting her to seek refuge for her young children in the neighbour's house for safety. The close proximity of the house to the ground restricts airflow and



contributes to discomfort during the summer, as high indoor temperatures make resting and sleeping difficult.

Sreymao has voiced her concern about the potential for ground floor flooding during heavy rain, especially regarding the safety and health of her grandchildren. She fears that wading through water may result in skin issues



such as rashes, itchiness, and even pose a drowning risk for small children. At times, rain occurs while they are sleeping, necessitating the use of plastic sheets to keep them dry.

Sreymao was thrilled to learn that Habitat for

Humanity in Cambodia will build a new brick house for her family. She expressed that a home is everything for their family, especially for her children and grandchildren. "A brick house is a symbol of a strong foundation for our family. It's a place where we can rest after work and have a secure and dry place to sleep, and keep our belongings safe when it rains," said Sreymao.

Sreymao is overjoyed to find out that a team of Irish volunteers will be constructing her new house. She is looking forward to meeting and welcoming all the volunteers, and she hopes they have a safe and healthy journey to Cambodia. Since the team will arrive in Phnom Penh during Cambodia's Pchum Ben's Day, one of the most important Cambodian traditional and cultural festivals dedicated to honouring deceased ancestors, Sreymao plans to lead them to the local pagoda to offer food to the monks for luck and to celebrate this holiday.

I ask you to pray for myself, Ada, Alex, Ann, Ciaran, Eddie, George, Gordon, Helen, Janice, Muriel, Olive, Pam and Valerie for safe travel and safe health while we are away. Pray also for Sreyamo and her family and the builders and staff from Habitat for Humanity in Cambodia who will look after us and who we will work alongside.

We look forward to about sharing the experience on our return.

#### **Cambodia Team Commissioning Service**

In his sermon the Archbishop encouraged the team in their calling to serve whilst reminding all of the congregation that this was a mission for all of us in the church.

"Your MISSION to Cambodia is a mission for us all. I say this because it is a people to people mission; it is a house to house mission; it is a habitat to habitat mission. Those of you who are commissioned today and will go on this mission will be transformed by hope and by humility in ways you cannot foresee. As the archbishop of the diocese, I

am delighted with this heartfelt initiative on the part of these three parishes of

Castleknock and Mulhuddart with Clonsilla

"A home is something we used all to be able to take for granted. From our earliest days, it simply was there. We enjoyed it. We appreciated it. But we never really thought about it seriously because many of us were so fortunate never really to have to do so. Everything is very different now at home and abroad. Up to 20 million people are perpetually on the move and homeless annually across the world and this does not include those who are homeless in their own country. It is often those who are needy but seem able to cope who get forgotten. Your initiative recognizes this and draws two families of people together across the world - East and West, North and South".

Following the sermon the Archbishop commissioned the team, he prayed for their journey and the team committed themselves to serving God and those they will encounter in Cambodia.

### NEW STONE ART FOR ST. BRIGID'S WALL

Rev Colin and Rev Natasha were delighted to be present at the unveiling of the beautiful new stone art work in the wall of St Brigid's Church.

The stone is another beautiful edition to our village and thanks to the wonderful Castleknock Tidy Towns.

The following is from the Tidy Towns social media:

Castleknock Tidy Towns is absolutely thrilled to finally reveal a new stone art piece for Castleknock, after working on this project for over five years. The stone is fitted into the stone wall of St Brigid's Church, located in the heart of the village. The art piece was commissioned by Castleknock Tidy Towns, designed by Brenna and Amy Crushell and carved by Liffey Memorials. Inspiration for the design came from the glass fanlight above the door of an adjacent old property. The art piece has been created in Irish limestone and is very much in keeping with the existing stone wall and its surroundings.

The stone is a wonderful permanent enhancement and a total contrast to the redundant, abandoned utility cabinet which previously occupied this high profile location for many years.
