#### RECTOR WRITES

Dear Friends,

Every year it seems that Christmas songs in the shops or on our radios are heard earlier and earlier each year as both retail and media contest to grab our attention for viewing numbers or sales.

Now I'm definitely not a Christmas Scrooge and I actually enjoy the build up to Christmas as I always feel it at least opens the opportunity to talk about the Christmas story. However, I do find it rather annoying when a Christmas tune gets into your head in the middle of November and you find yourself singing away to it without thinking. In the words of Peter Kays "Once Upon A Christmas Song" -

You'll be singing this over and over, and over again
Every December you'll hear it and say
Turn it up, play it loud
Every Christmas should be the same
Singing it over and over, and over and over again
It's getting in your head (it's getting in your head)
And if you're not singing it all night
You'd be telling a lie

Of course Christmas songs aren't renowned for their prize winning lyrics but many of you will remember when the battle for a Christmas Number 1 record created a real frenzy every year. As far back as 1973 we saw Slade's 'Merry Xmas Everybody' and Wizzard's 'I Wish It Could Be Christmas Everyday' go head to head, though amazingly in the end Wizzard only managed to hit number 4 despite now being seen as a Christmas classic. Eleven years later in 1984 we had Wham versus Band Aid, "Last Christmas" being another classic that didn't actually make it to number 1 in the charts. We've also had some bizarre contests through the years like in 2000 when our very own Westlife lost out to Bob the Builder.

With our media overload of the past few years it seems the frenzy over the Christmas number 1 has joined our lost traditions. Yet there's a song that sits at the very heart of Christmas that has the same ability to strike a chord in 2024 as it did when it was first sung by a young unmarried pregnant teenager over 2000 years ago.

Faced with the life changing, miraculous, unheard of, even the unbelievable revelation that this young woman was going to bear not only a child out of wedlock (something that was seen as

so shameful at the time it could even lead to death) but that this child was to be God's saviour for the world, Mary rather than run away, sings arguably the most beautiful "Christmas Song" in history -

'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;

he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'

When Mary's faith was hit by crisis, when her world was turned upside down her soul magnified the Lord.

Advent gives us a time to ponder and reflect as we prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas. In the midst of the busyness, the shopping, the parties, the meals and that wonderful catchy Christmas music, will we take time to ponder?

As I pause and look back on 2024, a year that was filled with many memorable moments, but also with times of sadness and worry. A year filled with love but also the rise of hate. A year with war and uncertainty. A year when our Parish travelled to the other side of the world and at the same time reached out to our local community. A year where loved ones were lost and new births brought joy. A year when I shared many moments with so many of you in so many different ways, and a year in which I failed and let some of you down. A year when I, like all of us, had

moments when both faith and doubt collided.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if the Christmas lyrics running around my head were not dreams of a white Christmas, or mistletoe and wine but rather the words of a young pregnant woman whose son was going to change the world forever. May my, and your, soul magnify the Lord.

I wish you all every blessing this Christmas. For some it will be full of love, joy and happiness, for others it will be different due to a loss of a loved one or a changed

relationship. Some will be surrounded by family while others will reach out to family across the globe. However this Christmas is for you, I pray you will know the love of the one who came into the world and brought light into the darkness.





















#### **TINY TOTS**






There were many wonderful entries across the whole school and it was a very difficult task for the secret judging panel to pick a winner.

We are delighted to be able to play a part in this community event.


#### **Monthly Prayer Gathering**


