

RECTOR WRITES

Dear Friends,

During our tour to Australia over the summer, Janice and I were blessed to spend a few days in Queenstown in the South Island of New Zealand. Queenstown is world renowned as a ski resort and is also the birthplace of the Bungee jump. What stands out most about Queenstown is the amazing scenery of the mountain ranges and Lake Wakatipu, scenery that begins the moment you step off the plane.

Queenstown is set to the backdrop of one of the most amazing mountain ranges in the world, the "Remarkables." The Remarkables are one of only two mountain ranges in the world that run exactly from north to south, the other being the Rocky Mountains. For those familiar with the Lord of the Rings and Hobbit movies,

the mountains set the scene for those movies.

There is a funny story to how this mountain range got its name. The original Ngāi Tahu inhabitants

called the mountains Kawarau. However, while surveying the area around Lake Wakatipu in 1857, surveyor Alexander Garvie was struck by the mountain's unique north-south alignment. He documented this as a "truly remarkable" feature. When the new settlers arrived and read his documentation it seems his observation that the mountains were remarkable stuck and the mountains have been known as the Remarkables ever since.

I was guite amused that Garvie's observation of the mountains became their name. It really does give rise to the phrase "first impressions count". It got me thinking about our first impressions and in particular what our (or others) first impression of our churches might be. I would hope that if our churches were to be named after peoples first impressions we would be labelled with words such as "welcoming", "peaceful", "holy", "friendly." Or wouldn't it be very special if someone came in to our churches and said this place is "remarkable!"

As Rector, along with our dedicated ministry team, churchwardens and others, long to make our churches a

place where people long to be and a place where people feel they belong. I know in our churches we have many "remarkable" people who make our churches a place of welcome.

In the book of Hebrews the writer urges the Christian community "let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another". Isn't that the church we long to be, a place where people are loved and encouraged, where meeting together is second nature. For me that is truly remarkable and what I pray for our churches constantly.

September sees a new beginning following the summer break with all of our organisations returning and lots of activity. I am so thankful

for all the wonderful volunteers who make this happen and for all who get involved. Also on Sunday 28th September we are holding a "Back to Church Sunday" with breakfast church in both St Mary's and in Castleknock Parish Centre. This is your opportunity to invite people along, either people who haven't been for a while or maybe those who have never been in our churches. I am challenging everyone to invite someone on that day. This is an opportunity for yourself if you haven't been for a while or invite family or friends to come and see what is happening. Church is so much better when you join us, perhaps you might just find it to be "remarkable", because the God we come to worship certainly is, in fact there really are no words to describe our God.

Please also ensure the individuals have carefully read the Health and Safety information which you will find here.



Please share this link with the volunteers and ask that they complete at least 24 hours beforehand."




Sunday Club




