## **RECTOR WRITES**

Dear Friends,

As you read these notes the clock will have already fallen back and the nights most certainly closing in. For many people, the dark evenings are a cause of both challenge and anxiety. The darkness can lead to some people feeling more down than usual and for many of our more senior parishioners the thought of driving to meetings on dark evenings can be off-putting, meaning they miss that personal interaction.

I would encourage everyone to keep an eye out for each other over these months. Perhaps you could offer a lift if you're coming along to Mothers' Union, Prayer Gathering or Bible Study to someone who you know would like to attend but doesn't like driving in the evenings. Also, rather than just drop them home at the door why not stay for a while for a chat and a cuppa, the feeling of loneliness is arguably the most pressing concern of our generation.

There is only one combat to darkness, light. Your smile, your offer of a lift or just your company can bring that light into the lives of others.

We as a Parish continue to seek to bring light to the lives of not only our parishioners but to our wider community. One way of doing this will be through our Christmas Tree Festival, which is a rather unique way of lighting up the darkness. Local schools, community groups, businesses along with church groups are preparing Christmas tree creations of various shapes and sizes. Some will be decorated trees while others will be bespoke one off tree like creations. When they come together at the end of November our church in Castleknock will be alight with God's love through the Christmas Story and God's love for our local community. This will truly be an opportunity to bring light into the darkness of the winter days.

This is a first for our group of churches and is a major undertaking so let's make it a real church family occasion by all working together to light up Castleknock and beyond. There will be varying opportunities to volunteer through creating trees, stewarding, setting up and taking

down, providing refreshments, etc. This is a Festival for all of our churches, so please don't leave it to

others, play your part, you'll enjoy the sense of community.


We will seek to bring light of course in other ways. On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> November we hold our annual Service for Healing and Remembrance. - Spread the word about the Festival weekend and invite people along.



Rev Colin then challenged us all to examine how hungry we are for God.










